

Sports Gaming Licenses

TYPE A:

Online Sports Gaming

- Online sportsbook through computers & mobile applications
- Maximum Number: 25
- May partner with 1-2 mobile skins or sportsbooks
- Must also hold a Type B license or have an operational place of business in the state

TYPE B:

Brick-and-Mortar Sportsbook

- Brick-and-mortar facilities with betting windows and terminals
- Maximum Number: 40
- May partner with 1 mobile skin or sportsbook
- Located according to county population limits and economic activity

TYPE C:

Sports Gaming Lottery Product

- Self-service terminals in establishments with Type D liquor permits
- Maximum Number: 20
- Proprietors may place kiosks at an unlimited amount of Type C Gaming Hosts
- Limits on bet types, number of kiosks, weekly betting amounts

The Ohio Lottery Commission has prepared the following documents for public comment:

A remote Host Stakeholder meeting will be held at 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 28th. The meeting agenda and link will be forthcoming.

Host Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be a licensed lottery sales agent
- Must hold a Type D1, D2, or D5 liquor permit
- Must be a for-profit corporation or association
- Must obtain a recommendation from the Lottery
- Must pay a non-refundable \$1,000 application fee to OCCG
- Must select a licensed Type C Sports Gaming Proprietor partner

Per the legislation, the following four bet types on events will be allowed by the OCCC for Type C:

- Over / Under
- Money Line
- Spread
- Parlay (maximum of 4 components)

Proprietors will offer a choice of self-serve kiosks or clerk-operated terminals at no cost. The legislation limits initial installation to two terminals **unless the Proprietor requests approval** for additional units, there is no hard cap on units.

Proprietors will be required to provide a full-service solution at each Host location they partner with, this includes items like:

Field Service

Maintenance/Service

Marketing

Equipment and Installation

Employee Training

Prize Processing and Payments

Hosts may be offered compensation by the Proprietor for the placement of equipment and operation of lottery sports gaming in their venue.

The bill allows players to wager using cash, debit, credit, and electronic accounts.

For prizes less than \$600, cashing may be credited to the player's debit/credit account or may be validated through a terminal for cash payment at any sports gaming Host of the same proprietor.

Prizes over \$600 are NOT cashed out at Host locations.

- Alternative methods for cashing will be provided by each Proprietor
- Looking at both mail and electronic options to be available
- These payments are subject to state and federal tax withholding, child and spousal support intercept, and state debt intercept

Host Pre-Qualification

Eligible Lottery Retailers will receive an email May 4th to pre-qualify for a Host license.

In May, lottery staff will begin pre-qualifying interested Hosts that meet eligibility requirements.

Pre-qualified hosts will be posted on the OLC website beginning in June for Proprietors to access.

The OCCC e-licensing portal is expected to be available for formal applications later this summer.

Draft Proprietor Rules will be released very soon for public comment. We will be holding a virtual stakeholder meeting on May 16th; details will be posted in announcements.

OLC will begin a pre-qualification process for interested proprietors in June similar to Hosts in May.

This will allow Hosts and Proprietors the ability to unofficially partner in advance of the OCCC formal licensing process.

Sports Gaming



Overview

On December 8, 2021, the General Assembly passed House Bill 29, legalizing sports gaming in Ohio.

The bill allows sports gaming through licensed operators of Type A online sportsbooks and Type B brick-and-mortar establishments. The bill creates a comprehensive licensing and regulatory framework under the jurisdiction and rulemaking authority of the Casino Control Commission. Included in the legislation is a framework to require the Ohio Casino Control Commission to select one or more (no more than 20) Type C Lottery Sports Gaming Proprietors to operate lottery sports gaming.

The Ohio Lottery Commission is required to contract with the Type C Lottery Sports Gaming Proprietors and to recommend eligible lottery retailers for a Type C Lottery Sports Gaming Host license.
