Chairman Blair called the meeting of the Ohio Lottery Commission to order at 12:00 p.m. The meeting was held via teleconferencing due to COVID-19 (coronavirus).

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF OCTOBER 14, 2020

Chairman Blair presented to the Commission for approval the minutes from the October 14, 2020 meeting. Chairman Blair made a Motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Commissioner Gupta. The Motion was affirmatively voted upon by all Commissioners present.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE VIDEO LOTTERY GAME THEMES

Charles LoPresti, Chief Legal Counsel, presented a Resolution to approve forty – eight (48) Video Lottery Game Themes.

Commissioner Blair moved to approve the Resolution, with Commissioner Hughes offering a second to the Motion. The Motion was affirmatively voted upon by the Commissioners present.

HOLIDAY CAMPAIGN PRESENTATION

Sandy Lesko-Sabbath, Deputy Director, Marketing, shared with the Commissioners the Lottery's Holiday Scratch Off game commercials Merry Millions and Safe Santa.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Greg Bowers, Deputy Director, Finance, provided to the Commissioners a financial update for the months of September and October 2020.

- Traditional Sales for the month of October were \$330.9 million.
- The daily Numbers games (P3, P4, P5) were up against last year by \$14.8 million, or close to 27.4%.
- Games played in social environments such as Keno, Lucky One, and Fast Play games were up by \$6.7 million or 16.3%.
- Revenue at the seven racinos fared well during the month. GGR was \$94.3 million, up by \$4.0 million over October 2019. Net revenue for the Lottery was \$30.5 million. This is a little more than \$1.1 million, or 3.6% more than last year.
- Profit from traditional lottery games for the month of October were \$97.2 million, \$2.2 million more than more than original estimate, and \$4.1 million more than last year.
- For the first four months of this fiscal year, total profits generated for the LPEF were \$418.4 million, or \$27.3 million higher than our budget, and \$23.7 million more than the first 4 months of last year.

NEW BUSINESS/EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS

Executive Director McDonald informed the Commissioners of the following items.

The agency held its first annual Thanksgiving Telethon. This was an agency-wide, virtual event, hosted by the Director and our Cash Explosion talent, Dave McCreary and Alissa Henry. The goal was to kick off the Thanksgiving Holiday and give back to Ohioans in need by encouraging monetary donations to the Ohio Association of Food Banks. Our agency-wide fundraising goal was \$2,500. The total money raised was \$10,000 with over 250 staff participants.

The Lottery Commission has been the recipient of the 2020 NASPL Powers Award. Each year, the North American Association of State and Provincial Lotteries recognizes one outstanding individual from every state lottery with the Powers Awards. The Powers Awards are presented in recognition of significant contributions lottery employees have made through exceptional job performance. This year's Powers Award recipient from the Ohio Lottery is Video Production Manager, Barry Riley. Barry is responsible for managing the production of the agency's Cash Explosion Game Show.

Looking back into 2020, the agency was successful in accomplishing our goals, from implementation of Mobile Cashing, our Super Retailer program, and record-breaking sales month after month. Looking ahead the agency will be expanding our digital presence. The MyLotto Rewards mobile app currently has over 1.1 million active registered users and has experienced significant user growth over the past few years. This digital platform is key to reaching new and existing customers and gathering key consumer insights that can be leveraged for promotional campaigns and product research and development. We plan to offer and expand features such as mobile cashing and additional second chance and cross promotional opportunities, which will ensure continued growth on this important digital tool. The Lottery is actively pursuing new trade channels for the scratch off product line. The Lottery is always exploring opportunities for expanding our retail network. We are currently in the process of recruiting major chains, including Wal-Mart, that will significantly expand our retail base but also require customized self-service vending equipment.

The Lottery will also explore opportunities for expanded promotion of problem gambling awareness as well as combined efforts with the awareness campaigns of the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services, and Ohio for Responsible Gambling. Our Responsible Gambling Director Karen Russo has done a great job for the Lottery.

A state-wide curfew will go in effect on November 19, 2020 for a period of 21 days. We do believe the curfew will apply to the seven racino facilities. We are waiting to receive official word from the Governor's office. The Lottery is taking all necessary precautions and is planning for the seven racino facilities to be closed every evening from 10pm - 5am.

ADJOURNMENT

With no further business before the Ohio Lottery Commission, Chairman Blair complimented the Lottery staff on doing an incredible job. Commissioner Blair informed Commissioners that the next meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 9, 2020 at 12:00 p.m. via teleconferencing.
